While we encourage everyone to study the level of maths at which they feel sufficiently challenged, below are some guidelines for the minimum level of maths required for some of our degrees. Please also see <u>Assumed Knowledge</u> for more information.

Type of Degree	Assumed Knowledge
Science with Mathematics Major	Mathematics & Mathematics Extension 1, study as much maths as you can
Science or Engineering	Mathematics and Mathematics Extension 1
Commerce with Actuaries, Finance or Accounting Major	Mathematics and Mathematics Extension 1
Health Sciences	Mathematics

Studying at least HSC Mathematics Extension 1 will leave your options open when you choose your university degree. Knowledge of mathematics is a useful skill in any profession, even if it is not required for a particular course. No doubt, you will have to use mathematical tools such as graphs and statistics for the rest of your life. Learning mathematics also teaches you to approach problems in a systematic and logical way.
